1. Real-time data used to inform national strategy on COVID-19

2. Surveillance data resulted in changes to NHS systems and messaging during COVID-19

3. Data used in support of advice for families to bring children to A&E during COVID-19

4. C-H-I-L-D acronym developed to ensure full reporting of COVID-19-related child deaths

5. Expert panel on suicide established to review data under COVID-19 and report published

6. Safety notices on danger of blind cords and face masks shared widely in support of Child Safety Week

7. Statement prepared for DHSC ministerial briefing paper on child safeguarding

8. Input into two Parliamentary questions on Morecombe Bay and serious case reviews

### DATABASE AND PROCESS

1. Real-time child mortality surveillance system established, linking with PHE virology test results

2. Data sharing agreement established with the neonatal clinical system BadgerNet

3. Data sharing with PHE National Disease Registration Service agreed in principle

4. Collaboration agreed with ONS to enhance the ascertainment and coding of child deaths nationally

5. Database improvements based on feedback including new alert and data extract functions

6. Working group convened to develop revised JAR guidance under COVID-19

7. Joined University of Bristol's UNCOVER group to address COVID-19 through research and data science

### CDOP AND CDR COMMUNITY

1. Over 6,000 cases submitted to NCMD to date

2. 100% CDOPs across England submitted cases to NCMD (average notifications 42)

3. High engagement regarding 2019/20 LSCB1 data (800 new cases created and 600 finalised in March 2020)

4. Data quality improved with 98% of notifications having a valid NHS number in April 2020 (90% 2019)

5. Data quality monitoring reports sent to every CDOP in January and April 2020

6. Best practice-sharing through NCMD webinar series, with over 110 participants in March and June 2020

7. Additional webinar on COVID-19 in April 2020, with max limit of 100 attendees reached

8. Professional Advisory Group – consisting of experts across the child death and charity sectors - convened

9. Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) group convened to ensure bereaved family representation

10. Guidance for running online CDOP meetings during COVID-19 published
